# A MAJOR MILESTONE

After many years of planning and fund raising, the Saint Francis Sculpture Garden realized its largest project to date. At a cost of over \$150,000, the bridge over the stream has been completed. After a ribbon cutting with donors and friends, construction proceeded quickly under the supervision of architect Greg Metz, and Erhardt Contruction manager Aaron Mead. A ribbon cutting ceremony was held on November 11 to the delight of all who made this dream possible. It now provides a gateway to additional acreage on the west side of the creek for the extension of this oasis of peace!











# A Major Challenge

Amajor challenge still exists for the bridge project, and that is securing the \$75,000 of funding for what may well be the largest and most significant sculpture in the Garden. Plans call for a sculpture of St. Francis and St. Dominic commemorating their meeting and also celebrating the Garden's development through the partnership with the Dominican Sisters. It will be installed with benches in the bump out in the middle of the bridge.

Sister Megan McElroy, O.P. commented at a Garden presentation in 2022, "... the meeting of St. Francis and St. Dominic. There is a question of if and how the two met, but both religious traditions hold that they did. From the Dominican perspective, it is said that Dominic had a dream about Francis the night before they encountered one another. They were both in Rome seeking approbation of their respective Orders and happened upon each other in

the Lateran Basilica church. One hagiographical source wrote of the meeting, "Encountering Francis in the church, Dominic recognized him as the one he had seen during the night. He ran up and tenderly embraced him with a kiss, saying, 'You are my comrade and will run together with me; let us stand together, and no adversary will prevail against us.' He recounted to Francis his vision; and from that time on they became but one heart and one mind in God."

The gift of the friendship of Francis and Dominic is one of light – for the church, for the world, for each other, and for others. Their friendship has continued to this day with their respective brothers in Rome who make it a practice to visit each other's convents on the two saints feast days. As they encountered one another, the light of

the Son – Jesus – shone brightly that day, and like the rays of the sun (that great celestial star), its rays continue to reflect upon us, calling us to that same witness of friendship, a witness that is sorely lacking in our world today. May the sun-touched gift of our friendships, our relationships, be a sign of hope, of love, of light in our day as the friendship of Dominic and Francis was in their day..."

# THE FUTURE

The future vision for the Saint ■ Francis Sculpture Garden is to complete the development across the bridge on the west side of the creek. Plans and research suggest that there could be room for a meandering safe path with numerous sculpture sites. Additionally, we plan to look at the possibility of dedicating a space for a "cappella nel bosco" (an "open air" chapel in the woods). This area would not require any physical structure, but rather have the natural setting of trees and shrubs form the "chapel." It would be the main meeting area for groups to use for any type of gathering, ie weddings, musical presentations, prayer services, etc. A large, cleared area would be totally accessible with natural "chapel pews" and a major sculpture. As was the case for the rest of the Garden, we look to and encourage the participation and generosity of the community in the realization of this vision.

### SFSG Welcomes New President, Tom Heitz



As I reflect on my life and how God lead me on my journey to the St. Francis Sculpture Garden, it truly began at my birth. Being the eighth child of a strong Catholic home, that same year, my oldest sister entered the Dominican order at Marywood as Sr. Janet Marie Heitz. My life was truly grounded by Dominican life, mass, and then dinners on Sundays, being educated by Dominicans for eighteen years through my graduate studies at Aquinas College, working for the sisters at the House of Studies on Aquinas College Campus during my college years and the Melodies blessing us with their singing at our marriage. During the last few years of my sister's life, our family would spend time with Sr. Janet, walking the Sculpture grounds.

I was introduced to Mic Carlson over 20 years ago when I was a board member of a nonprofit that represented adults with developmental disabilities, Guardian Angel Homes. Mic, with his involvement as an artist and benefactor for that organization, helped change the lives of those individuals that were underserved in our community.
